DENTON COUNTY WATER SUMMIT

“Will There be Enough Water for New Development in Denton County?”. “ Will I Have to Pay for My Own Well Water in the Future?”. “If Another Drought Hits, Will There be Any Help?”. “Is Our Water Supply Safe from Terrorist Threats?”. These are questions that have thrust water issues such as water availability, water rights, security and drought management issues to the fore front of local, county, state and national agendas. The effects of the 1997 - 2000 droughts dealt devastating blows to agriculture as well as climate sensitive businesses while the events of September 11, 2001 increased our need for security and dependable sources for water. Denton County Commissioner’s Court, the Texas Cooperative Extension - Denton County and the Denton County Water Council are proud to present the third Denton County Water Summit on July 26, 9:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m., in Denton at the Radisson Hotel on I-35 E. The short-day seminar will provide interested water professionals, business leaders, municipal representatives, agricultural producers and county residents a concentrated overview of the issues at hand and their effect on county development, land use and rural/agricultural production.

Trade booths will be provided by event sponsors. Full Summit registration covering speakers, refreshments, materials, and luncheon will be \$45 before July 15.
